Curriculum Overview

- English –Non chronological reports, adventure story, instructions, narrative fantasy, Dream giver Description, Adventure story, explanation, diary, persuasive letter, Recount letter, narrative myth, balanced argument, character description. We will be reading a range of different books and learning Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar too.
- **Maths** place value, the four operations, times tables, money, shape, graphs, measurements, fractions and statistics
- Science light, animals and humans, forces and magnets, rocks and plants.





Curriculum Overview

- **History** Stone age to Iron age, Romans impact on Britain, WW1, Local History.
- **Geography** Villages Towns and Cities and local dangers.
- Art Illustrators- drawing and painting (Quentin Blake, Beatrix Potter, Alex Sheffler) Drawing and Sculpture.
- **Design and Technology** Textiles printing -designing and stitching stone age clothing (tunic).
- **Computing** Coding and Algorithms , Making Music, Touch typing.
- Music Identifying the purpose of music ,Singing Development and pitch matching Instrument Focus: Brass instruments - Trumpet , Posture for standing and sitting Pitch, timbre, and phrase marks .
- Religious Education Expressions of Identity, Meanings within Christmas and Divali, The Person of Jesus.

Reading

- All pupils will be enrolled on the Accelerated Reader Programme.
- Please try and read daily, at home, with your child for 15 minutes.
- Please ensure your child brings in their reading folder everyday.
- Staff will check reading records on a daily basis.
- Children will receive rewards for how many times they have read at home
 - 25 reads = a book
 - 50 reads = hot chocolate and extra playtime

Physical Education

- P.E. will be taught on a Thursday each week.
- On your child's P.E. day please send them to school in their P.E. kit. They will stay in this all day.

• P.E Kit list:

- Plain white t-shirt
- Black jogging bottoms or shorts (they can wear jogging bottoms over shorts if they want the option)
- Black jacket or hoodie
- Black trainers or pumps
- Pair of socks.

<u>Homework</u>

- We would recommend you read with your child as much as possible at home and record this in their reading record.
- Children are to practise their spellings and times tables on a daily basis.
- The homework matrix will be shared with you at the beginning of every half term – we suggest a minimum of 4 tasks per half term to be completed.

Behaviour for Learning

- Three school rules; Ready, Respectful, Safe.
- Positive behaviour chart.
- Individual sticker chart.
- Consequences; <u>Step 1</u> Reminder; <u>Step 2</u> Verbal warning given; <u>Step 3</u> Last chance; <u>Step 4</u> Timeout; <u>Step 5</u> Repair; <u>Step 6</u> SLT Repair; <u>Step 7</u> Formal meeting with parents.
