

**Morpeth Road Academy
Sports Grant IMPACT Report 2024-2025**

- broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- increased participation in competitive sport

The funding each school receives is derived from the January census for Y1 to Y6 pupils. Morpeth Road Academy was allocated £ 18,350 in the financial year 2024 - 2025.
